

The first year seminar courses are special courses for first year students to enhance their academic and social integration into college. FYS provides an introduction to the nature of higher education and a general orientation to the functions and resources of the university. The course is designed to help first year students adjust to the university, develop a better understanding of the learning process, and acquire essential academic survival skills. The course also provides a support group of students in a critical transition by examining problems common to new students.

The class size of your FYS course will be no larger than 20 students. The class meets slightly longer than non-FYS classes so you have time to make deeper connections with your fellow students as you learn about the different services and opportunities that are open to you as a student at IUS. Your professor has been chosen because they want to work with freshmen students and are interested in providing advice and guidance that will enable you to achieve your college goals. In addition to helping you with study techniques, networking skills and time management, you will learn about leadership opportunities and social opportunities that can enrich your college experience. Some of the bonds you will make with your fellow FYS students will last throughout your college career.
